A shipping crate was given to us by Mary Teman. After Mary removed some covering from the crate, she found the name "Stahlkampf Company" as the shipping destination on the side. The Stallkamp family was able to provide the information that the store which was located at the present 209 North Main Street location received goods that were shipped on the Canal. Jane Stallkamp, widow of Tom, gave us the history of the store and the family as follows: Francis Stallkamp (wife, Josephine Hedrick, formerly of Ft. Jennings) started the store c1849. One side was used for groceries and the other for household goods, etc. This side sold lovely dishes called Queensware which members of the Stallkamp family are using in their homes to this

date. More about the Stallkamp family will be found displayed with the shipping crate.

A Civil War blanket donated by Dollie Wannemacher Wolke is now on display in the military section. She provided us with information about its origin which you can find in the Civil War section along with the blanket.

Many, many articles from the practice of veterinary medicine by Dr. Cletus Vonderwell have been donated to the museum. These have been catalogued and stored until our expansion is

completed, at which time they will be appropriately displayed.
